From the baseline report to the two Voluntary National Reports, data could not be captured for several indicators under some of the Goals. Furthermore, there were no reports under some goals in the two VNRs. As reported in relevant sections of this chapter, no narrative was entered under SDG 7 in the VNRs, the first VNR had no entries on Goal 8, the second VNR had no information on Goals 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 15."
