

Review of: "Collaborative Intelligence: A scoping review of current applications"

This article performed a survey on "collaborative intelligence" over the past decade, to understand how much it is materialized in practice. Through a comprehensive literature review involving up to 1250 papers, the authors identified 16 example applications, and categorized them according to their goal, type of interface, and benefits. It is shown that the concept of "collaborative intelligence" has been increasingly applied to real world usages.

The survey methodology is systematic and clearly described, including the scope of literature review, and the criteria for an application to be counted as "collaborative intelligence". I also appreciate the author's effort in screening the title and abstract of up to 470 publications. However, only 16 publications were involved in the final analysis, and this small sample size limits the comprehensiveness of the study.

Finally, the writing of the article is coherent and easy to understand.
