

Review of: "Raising Adaptive Capacity to Climate Change in Energy and Food Sectors of Egypt"

The text has improved significantly compared to the previous version and is much more structured. There are still some points that make it complicated to read:

The introduction should state that the article is concerned with reconstructing the impacts of climate change in the contexts of water, agriculture, and energy in Egypt. It should be clear from the outset that Egypt has a problem with a lack of studies and sources, and it should make it clear that the intent of the article is to provide an overview of these effects and a series of recommendations.

The methodological section is not entirely clear to me. What does the IMPACT model consist of? Was it used quantitatively or for a qualitative review? Furthermore, a methodological reference is again inserted in section 2.2.1. It could probably all be standardized.

I appreciated the conclusions compared to the previous version. I understand that the article is also aimed at decision-makers: it would then be useful to clarify the recommendations better. For example, in addition to the robust approach to dealing with climate change, it should be written in the conclusions that it is also suggested to resolve the problem of the absence of specific studies.

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
