The topic is interesting and contributes to the field. The methodology (phenomenology) was well chosen according to the subject matter and to the objectives of the study.

The article is written as if the pandemic and emergency remote classes are ongoing. If this is the case in Philippines, the author should mention it, as many parts of the world have returned to face-to-face classes. The introduction includes several generalizations that are not supported. For example, the author states, "The Philippines is one of the most affected countries around the world by the virus. The latest data show that the Philippines as of the writing is in the top 19th among the countries with the most infected with the virus." but does not mention where the information comes from. The objectives and/or research questions are not mentioned, but would be useful to the reader.

The discussion is superficial, as it simply rehashes what was mentioned in the literature review. This section should delve deeper into the findings and their importance.
