A Chi-square test was used to identify any significant differences among the participants' demographics and responses regarding certain statements in the questionnaire with a significance level of p-value < 0.05.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), inter-professional education is an experience that "occurs when students from two or more professions learn about, from, and with each other" (WHO, 2010). Inter-professional education has also been defined as "learning together to promote collaborative practice" (Hammick, 1998).
