1. No dose-response effects were attempted. Two or three doses above and below the ones used should have been tested for each drug.
2. Small group size. Increasing the group size to 8 or 10.
3. Have the authors tried using metabolic cages to collect total urine volume over a certain period of time? Using the metabolic cages facilitates the collection of urine output over a period of time, e.g., 4 hours.
4. Xylazine, being an alpha-2 agonist, is a diuretic in mice. This was not addressed. Using another anesthetic, such as thiopental sodium, might have helped to avoid xylazine effects.
