This section would be more attractive to the reader if the authors included a diagram or infographic to illustrate the information; otherwise, this section of the manuscript seems very long to me. Another suggestion could be to add some of this information to the introduction and eliminate this section from the manuscript.

This section on methods would also look better with an outline. Could the authors make this change?

RESULTS

I miss the fact that the values in the table accompany the results. They're too descriptive, too much text, and not enough numbers.
