The topic approached is very relevant for today's world. The paper tends to be practice-oriented, having stronger implications in this area compared to its academic relevance.

The investigation stresses the relationships between Planetary Health and Climate Crises, which is a very relevant topic that needs good understanding and, maybe, even a roadmap could be sketched. Still, we consider that the literature review in this field needs to be extended, to highlight various facets already presented in the academic publications. We recommend to consider also the framework, the strategies and actions, as well as the evaluations associated to SDGs No. 3 dedicated to Health and wellbeing.

Some sections of the paper are not so clear in terms of arguments - this is valid for the main aim of the paper, stated in the first paragraph. Also, this could be considered to improve the titles of the (sub)section of the paper. We consider that some proofreading and additional attention to the argument line and styling would be helpful for better understanding/to increase the access to the information and the results.

The paper could provide a suitable framework for better clarifying the concept of Planetary Health - a more comprehensive literature review and an encompassing definition of the term are needed - resulting in the same time is a relevant outcome of the paper.
