This paper addresses the challenging problem of on polydrug use, in particular new psychoactive substance use, among nightlife attendants. It is shown that the use of poly-drug use indicators can be useful for characterizing high-risk subgroups of users which is of great benefit to professionals working with this problem.

- 2. Could the authors insert the questionnaire with which the respondents were surveyed?
- 3. Given that the data was taken on an online survey, were there any limitations of the study.
- 4. By my opinion, the cited literature should be corrected in some references.
