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I enjoyed reading this paper and found it very meaningful. It was a comprehensive summary of the Anthropocene and easy and clear to read. However, although the title declares "Let the Transformative Anthropocene Be Positive!," the closing remarks are short and do not discuss how to make it a positive one, which is a little bit disappointing. Also, although the paper discusses the energy theory of the Anthropocene, such as food chains, it is disappointing that it does not discuss information exchange between organisms or a non-humancentric perspective rather than a humancentric one. We, humans, tend to think in a humancentric way, but it is also important to research that by looking at the behavior of other species from a non-humancentric perspective. To coexist with other organisms on Earth, we must learn the information system of those organisms from the perspective of Non-humancentric.
