Intramural coronary arterial course is a rare coronary artery congenital malformation disorder characterized by an atypical course of a coronary artery (usually proximal left anterior descending artery) in which, for a variable length, the artery runs intramyocardially. Depending on the artery and length of segment involved, patients may be asymptomatic or may present variable manifestations ranging from atypical angina to sudden death.
