

Review of: "Search for Meaning in the Professional Projects of Seniors at the End of Their Careers: an Interpretative Phenomenological Study"

The presented contribution has a formulated goal and this is fulfilled by the content of the contribution. It has a formulated structure and methodology, processing methods are identified, these are described in the contribution. The used methods of processing the contribution are relevant to the solved issues, they are adequately applied. The topic addressed in the contribution is interesting and, given the lengthening time of people's active working life, also very topical. The theoretical part of the contribution is prepared using the analysis of a sufficient number of relevant information sources, which are cited in the text of the contribution, paraphrased and subsequently listed in the Bibliography.

Outputs provide readable information. As a non-native speaker, I am not completely competent to assess the language side of the contribution, but it appears to be correct. However, what I have objections about is the number of survey respondents. A very small research sample is chosen. Based on the questioning of 3 respondents, it is not possible to obtain valid conclusions. It is necessary to examine at least 70 respondents to ensure the validity of the conclusions. In addition, the results obtained from the questionnaire survey are not further subjected to statistical investigation, hypotheses are formulated, but these are not adequately confirmed or refuted based on correlations and other contexts. Personally, I would recommend at least supplementing the relevant statistical surveys to make the results a bit more objective. However, it would be best to conduct the survey on a larger sample of respondents. The paper also lacks a comparison of the identified outputs with the outputs of available research and investigations and the formulation of conclusions in the context of the impact of the findings of the given investigation on, for example, the management of human resources in companies and institutions.
