The article evokes interest, as it compares two countries having wide economic and social differences. The article provides some general observations on these dimensions. However, as a research article, it requires a comprehensive revision.

1. In the introduction session, a clear delineation of the basis for the selection of Sweden and India would be useful. The quality of the article would be improved if the authors could provide the hypothesis(es) and the arguments for forming the hypothesis (es). It would be much more revealing if it could provide a glimpse of the theoretical basis for the study and the approach. Also, the references are insufficient.
2. Presently, it does not have an analytical or argumentative approach- its more descriptive. It is better to use some indicator variables (including indices) for comparing the two nations.
3. Also, the historical context of the differences also becomes quite important.

While the comparative approach offers cross-learning lessons, it would be better to give a glimpse of such lessons in the conclusions so that the paper could be more useful for policy making.
