After a careful reading of the article: Learning Corpus Christianum as a Theological Education Curriculum towards a Global Community, I want to provide the following assessment:

1. In relation to the proposed theme, I find it interesting and appropriate for Theology and the teaching of Theology itself, since it is true that the conditions of the world today make us think in global terms. Well, the world, as Morin himself says. It is true, as the author says that "Theological education is also inseparable from global life."
2. However, the article is very descriptive and does not lead to a critical analysis in relation to globalization and Theology.
3. The absence of updated references that support and give strength to the arguments is notable.
4. The article does not propose what a study plan or a curriculum in Theology consists of or what it would be like. The author says that his proposal should affect the study plan and the curriculum, but he does not say how it would be.

In short, I do not believe that the article in question achieves a level that can be considered as a research article.
