The paper discusses the antithetical relationship of entrepreneurship and corruption on radicalization. I find this theme very interesting, especially in the African context plagued by terrorism. The article thoroughly analyses the impact of corruption on the entrepreneurial climate in Morocco and the consequent impact on the radicalization of Moroccan youth due to a lack of opportunities. The root causes of corruption and its impact on the entrepreneurial ecosystem have been thoroughly addressed. The problem must be further justified, and the gap in the literature review must be clearly presented. The authors argue that: This paper fills the gap by examining the key research question of 'entrepreneurship and its efficacies towards economic and social progress in the presence of uncertainties due to inequality and radicalism'. Unfortunately, the results of the literature are not discussed. Moreover, the choices made need to be justified. There is a need for an update of the data and sources for section 3 (last reference is for 2016), section 4 (last reference 2020), section 5 (last reference is for 2016), and section 6 (last reference is 2013).

I suggest that the article may be published with a thorough proof reading to address a few grammatical errors.
