- 1. The problematique engaged by the authors of the paper is relevant and topical.
- 2. The authors made good the objective(s) of the paper to a reasonable extent.
- 3. However, a few issues is to be noted and addressed in order to further improve the substance of the paper.
- 4. The Abstract of the paper should be framed in simple present tense in order to reflect epistemic perpetuity.
- 5. The **Abstract**, meanwhile, needs to be made a bit more concise and lucid.
- 6. The central argument of the paper needs to be clearly stated and situated in theIntroduction.
- 7. There is a need for a theoretical framework to systematize the analysis and put it in proper perspective.
- 8. The segment titled 'Empirical Verification and Discussion' is redundant in its present context. It could be taken to the section that comes next to it as a preamble.
- 9. The paper fails to engage enough of the prevailing debates/ narratives on the subject area in order to legitimately foreground the epistemic gap(s) thereof.
- 10. Concepts such as 'Third Word' may be substituted for 'Developing Countries' in the light of its apparent infashionability in contemporary Social Science lexicon.
- 11. There is an assertion that must be corrected: 'What constitutes electoral irregularities depends on theoretical' . I think that should be ideological...
- 12. How would the alternative electoral system being proposed change the game?
- 13. Recommendations must be framed as actionable measures. So, it doesn't suffice to state the 'what'; the 'how' is paramount.
