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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

The document is well-written, and clear, and focuses on an interesting, useful, and timely subject matter: how digital technologies could improve teaching and learning in Africa. However, there are a couple of concerns that must be addressed.

- 1. "The study used a sequential exploratory design": this needs to be explained or cited.
- 2. How was the data validated? Something needs to be said about this.
- For clarity, descriptions of the terms used in the data analysis browsing skills, presentation software, digital communication, internet skills and computer basic skills - should be provided in the RESULTS section, not the DISCUSSION.
- 4. Recommendations made in the conclusion could be linked to the problems stated in the introduction by saying how the suggested changes might resolve present issues.
