Regarding the "sarcopenia and COVID" paper...the poor use of English markedly detracts from the hypothesis of the manuscript. From this reviewer's perspective, the paper needs to be rewritten before extensive review is possible. In addition, the potential MOA of sarcopenia, which is a continual process, is not clearly presented. Then the authors attempt to "link" inflammation with long-COVID and sarcopenia. NCDs are associated with chronic inflammation; singling out a novel association btwn inflammation and COVID does not make any clinical sense. All diseases, including NCDs and infections (viral and bacterial), involve an array of inflammatory responses.
