- The study does not follow the clear-cut dimensions of literature; no conceptual clarifications, no empirical dimensions as well no theoretical underpinnings. The authors could try and expand on these to give the work a robust lift.
- Methodological strategy is completely missing; Issues of research design, method, philosophy, population, sampling frame, techniques etc. are not stated.
- How was the study carried out? What led to the study? Justification of the different issues surrounding the study were not stated categorically.
- · Results not stated etc.
- · Communication is clear and language is technical, which is commendable.
- Contributions to knowledge is faint has some logical in-depth were missing due to lack of strong research undertone that were not followed in preparing the work.
- The discussions were normal and generalist in nature and not directive in addressing any specified objective.
