The statement "under-diagnosis in females is well-recognized and relates to their more subtle presentation with less overt hyperactivity, reduced fidgeting, and lower pressure of speech, leading to a later age at diagnosis in general among females" is very interesting, but It is suggested to include a reference about said statement, since it is central to this article.

The phrase: "They may perceive themselves as being weird or odd-ball, and they often fear, and may ultimately experience, both alienation and abandonment by others." It also has no references, it is suggested to substantiate the statement.

The same is true of the statement: "ADHD females are often sexually active earlier and report more sexual partners than their peers, making them vulnerable to increased risks of teenage pregnancy and sexually acquired disease."

If it is a theoretical review article, it is suggested to include sub-sections that clarify the argument, since the structure being followed is not clear and the topics appear mixed.
