However, some things that are interesting but missed from this article are:

- 1) I did not find a theoretical basis in the background of this research as an idea that supports the relationship between the variables studied
- 2) Hypothesis development needs to be explained to support allegations that emerge from the literature where the influence between variables will be tested
- 3) The discussion is still limited to explaining the results of statistical tests. It has not explained how it relates to previous research compared to the results of this research.
- 4) Theoretical and managerial implications need to be emphasized in this article

Hopefully this can be input for future work to produce articles and research that are useful and increase insight
