However, the manuscript could benefit from more balanced examples, a more concise narrative in some sections, and clearer connections between the various points discussed.

Recommendations:

- 1. Include more examples from non-European democratic countries.
- 2. Provide a clearer thesis statement in the introduction.
- 3. Make the section on stigmatization and discrimination more concise.
- 4. Expand the discussion on socio-economic status and health to include more global perspectives.
- 5. Provide more detailed recommendations for policymakers in the conclusion.

With these revisions, the manuscript will be a valuable contribution to the literature on global governance and the COVID-19 pandemic.
