The manuscript leverages cationic solid lipid nanoparticles (cSLNPs) targeting a prevalent infectious disease- Hepatitis B for vaccine development.

The size range of the nanoparticles is given as:

"The size of cSLNs ranges from 10 to 1000 nm extensively used for oral delivery of antigens to induce immunity

The strictest definition of nanoparticles is from 1 to 100 nm. Anything > 100 nm, should be stated in micron units.

Nanoparticle therapeutic constructs can provide a range of performance benefits that increase effectiveness: improved pharmacokinetics, improved safety profiles, improved stability, and targeted delivery.

Although a formulation is very effective biologically, if it cannot be reproducibly scaled to commercially relevant quantities, it is of questionable value.

The authors did not make a case for the cSLN preventing HBV infection.

The authors need to tone down their statements to make them realistic and truly reflective of the scope of the study.
