The author has mentioned about anticoagulant using aspirin in a majority of patients whereas Clexane or NOAC's are used only in limited number of patients. Aspirin is not an anticoagulant but an anti platelet drug and therefore comparison is incorrect.

The dosage of NOAC's isn't specified since various dosages have been used at different centres. Incidence of bleeding can be higher in the ones who have been given higher dosages
