Results and discussion: You are really not discussing a lot, but rather just listing the main points of other studies.

Your paper provides interesting insights, but it would be more valuable if you gathered your own data using some instruments. Otherwise, there isn't really anything new in the field, as you are just summarizing what you read. You can also go deeper into the literature and analyze it thoroughly, but I do think you can come up with interesting findings if you decide to turn your review of the literature into, for example, a case study.
