- 1. Affiliation of the authors appearing after the title does not match with the list after the abstract. It rather carries contradictory information about the authors. E.g., The corresponding author is from the College of Pharmacy or the Department of Physics?
- 2. It is primarily a short review article. The so-called 'survey-based study' is next to nothing. The study design is not clear it claims to encompass diverse demographics, but the sample size is not mentioned.
- 3. Of course, pandemics are periodic, but claiming COVID to occur after a century might give a false impression to the public that it won't occur during their lifetime.
- 4. The author has appropriately concluded that the importance of preparedness, surveillance, research, and collaboration are key components of a proactive approach to pandemics; probably the survey using Neutrosophic logic-based classification has no significance in this context.
