This is an interesting topic a follow up study with qualitative interviews would provide deeper insights into the experiences of the participants.

The sample representation could be also enhanced. Although the sample size was large and included various staff and student groups, efforts should be made to ensure a more representative sample. This could involve targeted recruitment strategies to reach underrepresented groups or adjusting the sampling technique to ensure a more balanced representation across different demographics.

To further understand the extent of hate crime incidents at the selected university, it could be beneficial to include a control group for comparison purposes. This would enable researchers to determine whether the reported incidents are significantly higher or lower compared to a similar institution without specific interventions or initiatives.
