- 9. After results, you discuss your results under the title "Discussion" with reference to other authors.
- 10. When discussing your results, do not repeat the results in detail.
- 11. The conclusion should just be a few lines putting down your deductions from the study.
- 12. Recommendations can be put under "Discussion," not under "Conclusion."
- 13. Well done for having such a relevant research objective.
