

Review of: "Measuring quality of life with the Parkinson's Disease Questionnaire-39 in people with cognitive impairment"

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This article has an important clinical statement that PD patients should not be excluded from research only on the basis of MOCA scale.

Test–retest reliability and interrater reliability were not done and are important to establish the reliability of the measure.

Additionally, social status data are missing for of survey participants. The social conditions they are live (home or nursing home, alone or with spouse) can affect their mental condition and thus their quality of life.

Despite these limitations, the psychometric testing of the Parkinson's Disease Questionnaire-39 (PDQ-39) among a group of PD patients with and without cognitive impairment provides some additional support for the reliability and validity of this measure.
