- The structural configurations, chronological arrangement of events and ideas, as well as the theories used in this work
 are commendable. However, it is incumbent on the authors to search for recent literature to season the findings and
 discussions in the study. Although there is no literature that could be regarded as anachronistic and irrelevant, I think
 new empirical studies would have been carried out on the subject of suicide within the spates of 20 30 years of the
 existence of some of the cited works.
- I think there is a plethora of literature and empirical works on the issue of suicide in Nigeria. Citing the WHO to interrogate some issues with respect to the subject matter is not exhaustive enough. Interrogations with the extant literature can be 'glocalised' starting from the global perspective to that of the local dimension.
- It is expected that the cited literature should be arranged in order of their dates of publication. The rule of consistency demands that the dates of the cited works be arranged in ascending order of recency of the studies.
