Review of: "Management of Choledochal Cyst of Cystic Duct in Adult: A Very Rare Case Report"

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Dear authors,

To start with, this is an interesting case report.

Kindly find my suggestions below.

1. The introduction part should focus more on the incidence, gender prevalence, clinical presentation, and management options of the cystic ductal variant of CDC.
2. More operative details, such as how the root of the cystic duct or the cystic common hepatic duct junction was reached. Intraoperative picture labelling would also be more informative, e.g., the cyst and the normal part of the gall bladder should be labelled separately. Other intraoperative details, like the size of the cyst, a picture of the cut section, and the number and characteristics of the stones found, should be mentioned.
3. In the discussion, the management of cystic duct choledochal cyst should be discussed in detail rather than the management of CDC in general. The follow-up duration and any need for repeat imaging of the patient should be discussed.
4. The above changes would improve the readability of the case report.
