## In summary:

Compelling rationale, but the article's scope not easily comprehensible; several methodological foundation and data demonstration concepts, as well as a different title, would improve the manuscript's acceptance and relevance.

## In detail:

The whole set of experiments can possibly be wrapped as Docker In Docker, so the technical/scientific community can check the reproducibility of results, help detect biases, and explore novel variables to explain the observed features.

The same can be done to the results and discussion, where the results data must be confronted and analysed thoroughly, always with adequate statistics. Also, would you please consider using more relevant and attractive results visualizations with plots, instead of pure text.

Maybe the current title ("Deploying WordPress in Docker: A Scalable and Secure Solution") led to a misinterpretation by the readers. Based on the actual scope shown in your article, my humble suggestion for a more suitable title, "WordPress in Docker: A Brief Literature Review and Conceptual Test Proposal," can help better highlight your contribution to the field.
