Review of: "Veering Philosophy Towards Its Public Role"

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The article is well-written, well-structured, and very readable. It is a good reminder of the importance of philosophical and critical thinking today. However, as it concerns itself with arguing for “a stronger engagement of philosophy in social life”, it would be tremendously helpful to provide some actual examples of the public role philosophy can or did play. In addition, it can further consider that philosophy is also “a way of life” – as a personal guide on how to live one’s life, how one can or should understand the world, and how one ought to respond to one’s world (for example, political engagement). In short, the type of philosophy as “a way of life” that is accessible, as advocated by ancient Greek and existentialist philosophers.
