

Review of: "Pairing Peer Education and Social Media for Adolescent Smokers with Disabilities"

The proposed manuscript needs to be extended in terms of an overview of the existing studies on the effect of peer education and social media on cigarette smoking among adolescents with disabilities. There is no description of the data and the methods to be used for the analysis of this topic. Respectively, there are no results from an empirical analysis and no discussion of the findings with respect to the effectiveness of different interventions targeting cigarette smoking among adolescents with disabilities based on peer education and social media. Although it is an interesting topic from which important insights for adolescent health promotion and intervention programs can be derived, the proposed text is an incomplete piece of work, and I would suggest developing it further in terms of an overview of the existing studies on the topic, a description of the data and methods, an analysis and discussion of research findings, limitations of the study, and implications for practice.
