Review of: "Anchoring Bias in Large Language Models: An Experimental Study"

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Timely, interesting area, worthy topic.

1. Generalisability: single set of questions, would be interesting to see varied questions from different domains to understand how prevalent the issue is and how generalisable these findings are.
2. Limited selection of models: In an ecosystem where we know models perform differently, it's important to replicate this experiment in multiple models to understand if this is a model-specific phenomenon or generalisable. If differences exist between models, then why? Do some models have specific biases or solutions?
3. Tabulated data is dense, and the manuscript is a difficult read currently. Much of the intro/discussion text itself is digestible and communicates effectively, but the body of the work is challenging to appraise. Authors should consider visualisations and figures to support interpretation and readers.
