

## Review of: "Listening to the Bats of Carajás: Applied Bioacoustics for Species Inventory and Environmental Use in a Mosaic of Forests, Savannas, and Industrial Mining in the Brazilian Amazonia"

The article is nicely written; however, it has so many minor grammatical mistakes. The use of dashes, commas, etc., is either not applied properly or lacking in some places. The use of the definite article 'the' is lacking in many places, including some subtitles. A new paragraph's first line, starting with a numeral, should be avoided.

There is no mention of the Audio Library for the comparison of bat calls, and if some individuals are identified only to the genus level, then how did it become possible to ascertain the records of new species from the area?

Some abbreviations used in the text do not match; for example, Carajas National Forest should be CNF instead of FNC. If FNC has a different meaning in the local language, then it must be clarified. Similarly, Maximum Energy Frequency should be MEF instead of FME.
