Area	Criteria	Comments
1. Hypothesis	The research hypothesis should be appropriate, clear, specific, testable, and falsifiable (i.e., able to be proven false).	An interesting hypothesis. A methods or proposed methods section based on a published framework would lend weight to the paper.
1. Results	Valid, but also be explained in a clear and logical way.	Might this be provided pending completion of a study?
1. Conclusions	Supported by the results, and their implications should be addressed.	Refer to above.
1. Writing Style	The writing style should be clear, cohesive, and easily intelligible. Ideas should be articulated and conveyed in a logically organised flow.	This is done well, however further references embedded into your arguments would lend strength that your paper is evidence based e.g. the arguments and examples of activities provided in the 'Cultivating a Generation of Problem Solvers' section could be referenced.
1. English	Grammatically, logically, and syntactically correct.	Well written. Depending on the journal, you may wish to maintain writing third person (please refer to the last sentence in the Introduction section).
1. Impact	Interesting and significant, deal with important issues and/or topics of interest for the scientific community and the general public of readers, and have practical applications and/or relevant implications.	Definitely an interesting and significant topic, however further research, study and evidence-based references would contribute to the impact of this paper.
1. Novelty	Creative and original, advance understanding or bring other innovations to their field, or are on a new topic about which little is known or little literature is available	There has been quite a body of work around this topic that could inform your research further. I look forward to reading your final publication.
