The manuscript is quite interesting, and focuses on current themes (climate changes, Anthropocene, etc.).

The author points out that it is an essay, and, in fact, I did not identify elements that characterize a research, since there is no description of methodology, results, etc.

As an essay, the text presents a reflection that was based on several authors, and in the references I realize that they are not so current, and point to several authors who have discussed the Anthropocene.

The author indicates "literacy" in the title, but incipiently discusses education in Earth system sciences in formal education, for example, as a way of achieving the proposals discussed in the text.

The title also mentions "responsible geosciences", and this approach should discuss geoethics. The format of the manuscript, as an essay, should bring debates about geoethics, since in the last decade several authors have discussed and researched the impact of geoethical behavior of urbanites in large urban centers.
