As indicated below, but not limited to, some parts of the paper lack technical content and structure. Therefore, unfortunately, I do not recommend publication.

- 1. The novelty of the study is not clear.
- 2. The previous literature has not been sufficiently reviewed.
- 3. The methodology has not been clearly given.
- 4. Authors always have to write a paragraph saying: "The rest of the paper is organised as follows. Section 2 contains the literature review. Section 3 contains the methodology (method). Section 4 contains the results. Section 5 contains the conclusions and policy implications," so the reader knows what's coming next.
- 5. The conclusion section is too simple.
- 6. The citations are too few.
