The authors used the Expanding Participatory Epidemiology to explore the Perceptions of Human and Livestock Diseases among Pastoralists in Kenya. Both the subject and the method are relevant.

The manuscript describes a technically sound piece of scientific research with data that supports the conclusions. Experiments have been conducted rigorously, with appropriate qualitative research method, and sample size. The conclusions are drawn appropriately based on the data presented.

The statistical analysis has been performed appropriately and rigorously.

The manuscript is presented in an intelligible fashion and written in standard English: the paper is written in clear, correct, and unambiguous style. However, the authors didn't use the past tense to report the objective in the introduction section: « This study aimed to identify... »
