This article deals with a very interesting but underinvestigated topic. Nevertheless I'm some observations and suggestions.

In general, in a study on sociosexuality, in my opinion, the role of gender, age and education should be considered, both in the theoretical frame, with reference to literature, and in the data analyses.

In particular, since the sample of this study is made up almost entirely of females (167 females out of a total of 194 participants), why isn't this research contribution focused only on the female gender?

I would also suggest carrying out correlation analyzes weighted by age and years of education.

Furthermore, among the limitations and future developments of this research, a more balanced and representative sample of the adult population should be considered.

What does the following sentence mean? "75,3% (n=146) and 13,9% (n=27) were university graduates". Is something missing?
