The work touches on many important topics both socially and environmentally. However, it is difficult to evaluate this work. If it is to be a scientific work it needs many changes. I propose to change the form of the abstract. Supplement it with specific results from the work. The abstract is supposed to encourage the recipient to read the whole work. Indicate the scientific problem in the paper. It must be preceded by a literature review. The research methodology and results are missing from the paper. I believe that the detail of the description of the appeals made by the parties should be reduced. The work as a description of the activities carried out is very interesting. I fully agree with you that urban infrastructure development affects the environment. Therefore, we cannot allocate all available space for development. A balance between human activity and the environment must be undertaken. I think you should develop this direction in your research. You have a lot of valuable information in this area. Attempt to develop an appropriate structure in management so that building investments are carried out with full respect for the environment. I propose perhaps to further develop the issue of the impact of the methodology of environmental impact assessment of investments. Compare its scope in several countries and evaluate the results obtained. Solving such problems in courts is a last resort.
