

Review of: "Climate Change and Sustainability: A Comparative Case Study"

This work deals with a topic of primary interest and constant concern. However, after a leisurely reading of it, I regret to say that it does not meet the minimum requirements for publication as a scientific article, since it does not add anything substantial to the knowledge of the subject. My main objections are the following. First, the introduction is poorly written and the objective of the work, as well as its relevance, needs to be justified in much more detail. Likewise, it would be desirable for the authors to show what is already known about the topic to better delineate their own contribution. Second, throughout the work the authors make a series of statements, but they do not cite a single source or reference that supports them and in which they can be contrasted. Third, I also find the conclusions redundant with respect to what is stated in the preceding paragraphs. Fourth, the references cited in the bibliography are not used throughout the article. I encourage the authors to address these concerns.
