

# Review of: "Switching Away From Smoking and Reduction in Cigarette Consumption among US Adult Purchasers of the JUUL System across 24 Months Including Diverse Subpopulations Disproportionately Affected by Cigarette Smoking"

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The funding source and authors are from JUUL. There is a large amount of data being reported in the article, but the limitations that the authors point out are important as it is a sample of people who purchased JUULs so the sample would be skewed to people willing to try ENDS. This sampling technique does not allow us to make widespread conclusions of AWS. The authors do not do a good job presenting a balanced review of more recent articles of ENDS harms. Many of the citations are old 2016-2018 when we did not know as much about ENDS and thought they would be a harm reduction strategy- now that is not the case. The authors do not even mention the harms associated with ENDS and the lack of long-term data.
