

Review of: "The Impact of Project Financial Subsidies on Project Achievement"

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Potential competing interests: The article, "The Impact of Project Financial Subsidies on Project Realization". The dissertation does not have the complete structure of an article, as the abstract lacks an indication of the research objective, the method and the conclusion. The introduction lacks the debate with other studies and the research gap. The theoretical framework, methodology, results and discussion are missing. Finally, in the conclusion, the discussions are summarized. I think it's a report on a public decision adapted (public policy) by the local government, on the effects of financial subsidies. This is because it highlights the improper allocation of public resources with financial repercussions on social actions and their interaction with the local community. The public policies regarding Agricultural Extension in the New Millennium, oriented by Demand in Malawi with the practices of the DAS, are confusing and need to be better clarified. Especially with regard to items 10 and 15. The discussion on the influence of DIEMS on the project cycle suggests actions to minimize the negative impact, but is not based on the literature. There is also a lack of literary citations throughout the text. Similarly, it is found in the quotations about diaries - without any literary citations. It seems to be the authors' own manifestation. The arguments about the partnership between government and NGOs on the subject discussed, as a regulator of good practices in the execution of political actions, especially those involving social issues, lack empirical examples in other countries.

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
