

Review of: "Recognition Ambiguity! Kenya's Foreign Policy Towards Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, Israel, And Palestine Under Moi Era (1978-1990)"

The title is well elaborated as it meets the methodological requirements. However, it discusses Kenya's foreign policy towards Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, Israel, and Palestine without specifying the dimension around which it will be studied. The inclusion of the temporal scope is relevant.

One of the main observations aims to highlight that the author uses several paragraphs from their own article titled "Recognition for Convenience! Kenya's Foreign Policy towards South Africa under Moi's Era (1978-1998)" that are practically identical and are not cited, which is not appropriate.

In the section "History of Kenya's Foreign Policy," there is no effective overview of Kenya's foreign policy history, as only superficial issues are mentioned. Later in the article, subtitles are included for each of the countries mentioned in the title. However, they lack the necessary development to claim that Kenya's foreign policy towards these states is analyzed in the period under study... they are merely comments on each of them.

Perhaps it would be more convenient to choose fewer countries and conduct deeper analyses. This is just a suggestion, primarily for methodological reasons.

The citations throughout the text are presented in different ways, so it is recommended to unify the citation criteria.
