## **Comments to the Author**

The manuscript entitled "Larache's Coastal in Morocco: Evaluating Dredging's Impact on Fisheries and Shoreline Evolution," which was submitted to Qeios, has been reviewed. The comments are included at the bottom of this letter.

The manuscript holds scholarly significance and appears to be interesting. However, several parts require improvement. Firstly, the title of this manuscript needs refinement. Additionally, the abstract is very poorly written and lacks detail. The text itself contains numerous spelling and grammatical errors and requires thorough review.

Specific recommendations for improvement include:

- 1. Suggesting the title "Assessing the Effects of Coastal Dredging on the Moroccan Coast."
- 2. Expanding the abstract to include details on the methodology and results, while maintaining conciseness.
- 3. Adding information under the section "Physical Effects" in the introduction, explaining why Larache's coast was chosen as a case study and detailing its current status. (Add some recent pictures)
- 4. Referring to a recent bathymetry map of the study area in Figure 2.
- 5. Including a map of the geographical position of the study area.
- 6. Incorporating recent citations and references into the manuscript.
- 7. Providing more explanation about the coastal environment at Larache Beach.
- 8. Strengthening the discussion section by comparing simulation results with similar studies conducted in Morocco and abroad, and analyzing differences in environmental morphology.



The authors need to rewrite the manuscript, arrange the work correctly, and explain the results properly. There are too many mistakes. Correct the language with the help of a native English-speaking professor.

The manuscript cannot be accepted in its current form.
