**Lack of Detailed Methodology:** The methodology section is insufficiently detailed. The processes of data collection need further clarification to ensure transparency and reproducibility. Providing more information on the research design, sampling methods, and tools used would enhance the overall quality of the study.

**Incomplete Information on Data Collection Location:** The article lacks clarity regarding the location of data collection. It is crucial to specify the exact sites within the Calabar Metropolitan Area where data were gathered. This information is essential for readers to contextualize the findings and understand the study's relevance to specific areas.

**Absence of Comparative Analysis:** The article fails to compare its findings with existing studies in the field. A critical discussion that places the research in the context of other relevant works is essential. This would not only strengthen the paper's academic rigor but also provide readers with a broader understanding of the subject matter.

**Recommendation:** Due to these shortcomings, I regret to inform you that I cannot recommend the article for publication in its current state. Addressing the mentioned issues, particularly by enhancing the methodology section, providing detailed location information, and incorporating a comparative analysis, would significantly improve the overall quality of the manuscript.

I encourage the authors to carefully consider and address these points in a revised version of the article. I believe that with these improvements, the research could make a valuable contribution to the journal.
