While the paper briefly discusses the Second Chechen Conflict, it fails to consider several important events and issues that characterized the North Caucasian republic and Russian domestic politics. A more comprehensive analysis of these conflicts would provide a deeper understanding of the complexities involved.

Overall, the paper has the potential to contribute to the field with further development. By incorporating a stronger methodology, conducting a comprehensive literature review, and addressing the missing sections (Methodology of Research, Literature Review, Conclusion), the paper could provide a valuable contribution to the field of study.
