# Review of: "Is There a Hereditary Cancer Resistance Genotype?"

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An important research topic presented in a readable way, but overall it lacks any significant level of detail and does not provide any novel analysis. Unfortunately, it reads very much like an AI-assisted piece, which has not been manually curated or analysed. The author needs to go back and read into specific areas of interest, rather than give such a thin and broad overview. For example, the authors write "Certain germline mutations beyond MSI2 and HLA variants offer protection against specific cancers by enhancing DNA repair, modulating immune responses, or inhibiting tumor growth pathways". Each of those examples would be a review with hundreds of references in their own right, but here that is the sum total of information. At present, this is a brief overview/narrative piece best suited to entice an undergraduate audience into reading more on the topic - it is not a scientific review.
